- Develops student support plans/goals based on observations, teacher feedback, parent information, testing results, and documents student progress.
- Collaborates and communicates with educators and parents regarding student needs, plans, and progress. When appropriate, collaborates with outside professionals.
- Assists teachers with intervention strategies.
- Collaborates with the director of Student Academic Support on student needs.
- Attends weekly department, grade level, and/or all school meetings.
- Serves as a co-teacher with a student advisory group.
